Schedule Note:

Due to it getting dark early, 1st and 2nd period have been switched for the winter. This allows for students to complete electives and travel back to the commons before it gets dark.

Elective Descriptions

Basketball – Guided by Mike, students will learn the fundamentals of basketball. Through various drills, students will learn ball control through dribbling, layup and jump shots and team play.

Cartooning – Guided by Mike, students will be able to learn how to sketch and draw cartoon characters. Students will learn about coloring and shading as well as different styles of drawing and writing their names with background pictures.

Chess Club – Guided by George, the Chess Club is for beginners or advanced players. Beginners will learn more about the game and history of Chess. They will learn about the different pieces and their value as well as the history of and information on the board. More advanced players will learn variations on ways to play the game. Students will come away with an understanding of not only the game but tactics on how to win.

Creative Thoughts – Guided by George, it is a space where students will be allowed to create and explore their thoughts into creative written words, imagining, role playing and modeling. Students will express their thoughts and ideas using words, art and dramatizing. Creative Thoughts will inspire other students positively, and will help them develop leadership qualities for the bright future they deserve.

Explorers – Guided by Eli, the Explorers comprise a group of students who are invited to engage their minds and follow their hearts in a weekly exploration through the woods and across the streams of Barrie's campus. Explorers are encouraged to suspend disbelief, to look at the world in ways that inspire different thinking, to complete tasks that are imaginative and a bit strange, and to conduct experiments on a regular basis.

Elective Descriptions

Floor Hockey – Guided by Andrew and Dan, students will learn the fundamentals of hockey using padded hockey sticks. Through various drills, students will learn the difference in puck/ball control, variations on different shooting techniques and positioning on the floor. Each class will end with a scrimmage.

Free Sports – Guided by Mike, students will participate in various sports as well as variations on common sporting games. Students will also participate in typical camp sports games.

Sign Language (paired with Classic Card Games) – Guided by Betsy, this will be an intro to American Sign Language vocabulary with topics including, but not limited to, the manual alphabet, numbers, food, animals and verbs. There will be direct instruction followed by an activity to practice. Students will be reviewing signs from previous weeks as well. This program will run for the first half of the trimester.

Classic Card Games (paired with Sign Language) – Guided by Betsy, students will be taught how to play classic card games such as crazy eight, old maid, Jen, 500 Rummy, and Casino. Some variations on solitaire will be demonstrated as well. Card games are social and do not require batteries! This program will run for the second half of the trimester

Storytelling – Guided by Andrew, students will hear a wide variety of children's stories from fairy tales to Curious George and then participate in activities related to the stories. Activities include memory games to coloring pages. Students will also be given the opportunity to create their own stories to read to the group.

Please sign up your child(ren) for an elective during 1st and 2nd period. All students must be signed up for an elective each day.
