Elective Descriptions

Basketball Clinic– Led by Mike and Andrew, students will learn the fundamentals of basketball as well as safety, team work and sportsmanship. Through various drills, students will learn ball control through dribbling, layup and jump shots and team play as well as the various rules of basketball. Time permitting, each class will end with a scrimmage.

Camp Sports – Led by Mike and Andrew, students will participate in various sports as well as variations on common sporting games. Students will also participate in typical camp sports games.

Cartooning – Led by Mike, students will be able to learn how to sketch and draw cartoon characters. Students will learn about coloring and shading as well as different styles of drawing and writing their names with background pictures.

Creative Thoughts – Led by George and Eli, it is a space where students will be allowed to create and explore their thoughts into creative written words, imagining, role playing and modeling. Students will express their thoughts and ideas using words, art and dramatizing. Creative Thoughts will inspire other students positively, and will help them develop leadership qualities for the bright future they deserve.

Explorers – Led by Eli and George, the Explorers comprise a group of students who are invited to engage their minds and follow their hearts in a weekly exploration through the woods and across the streams of Barrie's campus. Explorers are encouraged to suspend disbelief, to look at the world in ways that inspire different thinking, to complete tasks that are imaginative and a bit strange, and to conduct experiments on a regular basis.

Elective Descriptions

Flag Football – Led by Mike and Andrew, students will learn the fundamentals of football as well as safety, team work and sportsmanship. Through various drills, students will learn the including the proper way to hold and throw a football, catch and route running. Time permitting, each class will end with a scrimmage.

Outdoor Living Skills - Led by George, students will learn basic outdoor skills regarding the various camp fire building techniques as well as fire safety, how to pitch a tent, campground preparation and safety, and more.

Soccer Clinic– Led by George and Mike, students will learn the fundamentals of soccer as well as safety, team work and sportsmanship. Through various drills, students will learn ball control through dribbling, passing and shooting as well as goaltending and the various rules of soccer. Time permitting, each class will end with a scrimmage.

Storytelling (paired with Archery)– Led by Andrew and Betsy, students will hear a wide variety of children's stories from fairy tales to Curious George and then participate in activities related to the stories. Activities include memory games to coloring pages. Students will also be given the opportunity to create their own stories to read to the group.

Archery (paired with Storytelling) – Led by Andrew, students will be taught the proper technique to holding a bow, loading an arrow, aim and release. Students will also be taught safety while at the Archery Range.

Theater Games – Led by Sharon and Betsy, students will play improvisation games that will help them develop their creative and performance skills. They will also participate in creating their own skits, which they will be able to perform in front of their peers.
