Activity Descriptions

Storytelling – Students will get to explore new stories from all around the world, and through the ages. From mythology to fables, from fairy tales to classic stories, students will engage in a wide range of new literary adventures, and in turn, get to create some of their own!

Artistry – Students will be taught the proper technique to paint a portrait of various items in the classroom. Using watercolor paint, they will be able to capture still life and bring their projects home for display. They will be able to advance their concentration and attention to detail, as well as a beginner's level to understanding color and light.

Bowling – Students will be able to use our duck-pin bowling set in Strauss, and learn how to keep score, proper bowling techniques, and sportsmanship.

Cartooning – Students will be able to learn how to sketch and draw cartoon characters. Students will learn about coloring and shading as well as different styles of drawing and writing their names with background pictures.

Special Event – Once a week, Ryan will present a new activity to the group. It could be a relay race, or a treasure hunt, or The Search for The Abominable Snowman where we follow tracks and clues into the Barrie Woods to find the mythical creature. All of the special events will be focused around community building, socialization, problem-solving, and teamwork.

Activity Descriptions (cont.)

Basketball – Students will learn the fundamentals of basketball as well as safety, team work and sportsmanship. Through various drills, students will learn the including the proper way to dribble and shoot a basket, pass and rebound, and different defenses. Time permitting, each class will end with a scrimmage.

Junior Explorers – Comprise a group of students who are invited to engage their minds and follow their hearts in a weekly exploration through the woods and across the streams of Barrie’s campus. Explorers are encouraged to suspend disbelief, to look at the world in ways that inspire different thinking, to complete tasks that are imaginative and a bit strange, and to conduct experiments on a regular basis.

Floor Hockey - Led by Mike, students will gain an understanding of hockey by using foam hockey sticks and rubber balls for scrimmage purposes in Strauss. Gaining knowledge of an intricate and focus oriented sport, and learning how to work as a team.

Hiking– Led by Ryan, students will develop a love for nature and explore the world of navigation as we make our way through paths on campus, we will create maps, charting our expeditions while taking in the beautiful Winter landscape.

Creative Thoughts– Using their imaginations to the fullest, students will be able to learn how to bridge their innovative or creative ideas into material fruition. They will collaborate, invent, design, and explore their surroundings and themselves to truly discover the limits of their creativity.
